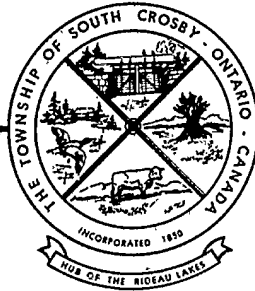

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF SOUTH CROSBY
BY-LAW NUMBER 29-86

A By-Law to designate the property known municipally as Red Brick School, Lot 48, on the Southeasterly side of Halladay Street, as shown on a Plan of the Village of Elgin as Registered Plan No. 88, Township of South Crosby, as a property of architectural value or interest.

Whereas Section 29, of The Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 337, authorized the Council of a Municipality to enact By-Laws to designate real property, including all buildings and structural or historical value or interest; and

Whereas the Council of The Corporation of the Township of South Crosby has caused to be served on the owners of the lands and premises known as Red Brick School at Lot 48, on the Southeasterly Side of Halladay Street, as shown on a Plan of the Village of Elgin as Registered Plan No. 88, and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, Notice of Intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks; and


Whereas the reasons for designation are set out in Schedule B hereto;

Whereas no notice of objection to the proposed designation has been served on the Clerk of the Municipality;


Therefore the Council of The Corporation of the Township of South Crosby enacts as follows:

1. There is designated as being of architectural value or interest the real property known as Red Brick School, Lot 48, Southeasterly Side of Halladay Street, as shown on a Plan of the Village of Elgin as Registered Plan No. 88, more particularly described in Schedule A hereto.
2. The Municipal solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this By-Law to be registered against the property described in Schedule A, hereto in the proper land registry office, (Leads No. 28)
3. The Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this By-Law to be served on the owner of the aforesaid property and on the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of the passing of this By-Law to be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks.

Read a first, second and third time and finally passed this 21st day of July, 1986.

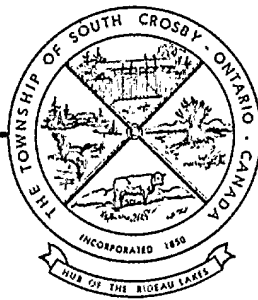

REASON FOR DESIGNATION

Constructed in 1887, this single storey, red brick school was the site of the elementary education of Elgin children until 1964.

It features three multi paned windows along the north facade, with a gable above each, the central gable being ornately curved. Two entrances are located on opposite sides of the building. A bell tower originally rested at the peak of the roof.
