TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Township of South Crosby intends to designate the property, including lands and buildings, known as All and singular that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate lying and being in the Village of Morton, Township of South Crosby in the County of Leeds and being composed of Lot 12, 13 on North West side of Queen Street and Lot 14 on the North East side of Judd Street according to a plan of subdivision for the Village of Morton, saving and accepting thereout and therefrom the Easterly 15 feet of said Lot 13, as a property of architectural value or interest on Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1980 R. S.O. Chapter 337.

This 1½ storey frame house is associated with George Morton, who in the mid 1800's was influential in the Village of Morton. It is possible that he was responsible for construction of the Octagonal School House in the Village. This house features casement windows, also seen in the school and several other village home. The verandah, with its many windows, is particularly significant.

Notice of objection to the proposed designation, together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts may be served on the Clerk of the Township of South Crosby before the 15th day of April, 1983.
