TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Village of Lakefield intends to designate the property, including lands and buildings, at the following municipal address as a property of architectural and historical value or interest under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122

a) CHRIST ANGLICAN CHURCH

Municipal Address

Christ Anglican Church at 62 Water Street, Lakefield, Ontario.

Reason for the Proposed Designation

"Christ Church and its adjoining cemetery are recommended for designation for their architectural and historical significance.

Built in 1853 Christ Church was founded by the early settlers of Lakefield. It is the first parish in the Village and one of the oldest remaining Churches in the area.

The Church was designed in the gothic style by Kival Tully, architect for the Government of Upper Canada and son-in law of Colonel Strickland.


The walls are of hand-cut limestone, with a bell tower on one end and buttresses at the corners. The gothic arch window openings are framed in pine. The roof is cedar shingled.

Inside, the floor is of broad pine boards, and the walls form a high arch, finished in plaster. Overall, the construction is a good example of local craftsmanship using the local materials.

The Churchyard was used as a community burial-ground until 1886, and the headstones record many of the area's earliest settlers."
