Enclosed, for your information, is the advertisement in regard to this designation. If you have any questions please do not hesitate to contact the undersigned.



South Glengarry TOWNSHIP OF SOUTH GLENGARRY.

In the matter of the Ontario Heritage Act,  
RSO 1990, CO 18, as amended and in the matter of the property at 19408 Gore Road, Part 1 on Reference Plan 14R-3852, part of Lot 8, Concession 3 Front or Gore, in the Township of South Glengarry, (former Charlottenburgh), County of Glengarry, Province of Ontario.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE THAT the Council of the Township of South Glengarry intends to designate the property at the above address as a site of historical value and interest under Part IV of *The Ontario Heritage Act*, RSO 1990, Chapter O.18., as amended.

REASONS FOR PROPOSED DESIGNATION

The house at 19408 Gore Road was built by Finnan McDonald in or about 1828. Although many of the original architectural features of the house have been altered over time, the building is historically significant for its connection with Finnan (the Buffalo) McDonald (1782-1851). Finnan McDonald joined the fur trade of the North West Company in 1804 and worked in the Columbia with David Thompson, the mapmaker. In 1827, Finnan McDonald's famed lengthy fight with an enraged buffalo earned him a considerable reputation in the East. He retired to Glengarry and is buried in St. Raphael's cemetery.

Any person may, before December 10, 1998, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the Township of South Glengarry, notice of objection to the proposed designation together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts. When a Notice of Objection has been received, the Council of the Township of South Glengarry will refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a hearing and report.
