TAKE NOTICE that the Council of The Corporation of the City of Thunder Bay intends to designate the property, including lands and buildings, at the following municipal address as a property of architectural and/or historical value or interest under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S. O. Chapter 122:

ST. ANDREW'S PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH on the southwesterly corner of Brodie and Donald Streets in the said City of Thunder Bay.

Built in 1908-09, St. Andrew's was designed by local architects John Stinson and William Hood. In the Decorated Gothic style, the sandstone Church features large pointed window openings with stained glass and tracery, buttressed towers of unequal height, and an open entrance vestibule with arched openings supported by clustered granite columns with carved foliage capitals. The entrance vestibule is roofed with a battlemented parapet.

St. Andrew's has been used continually as a Presbyterian Church. Its site dominates the City Hall Square.

Notice of objection to the proposed designation, together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts may be served on the Clerk of the City of Thunder Bay within thirty days of the first publication of the NOTICE OF INTENTION.
